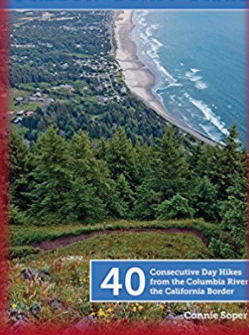

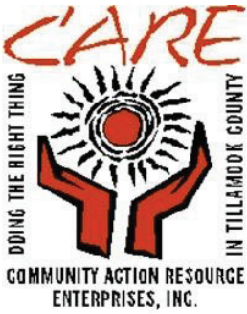

CARE Inc. is a locally controlled non-profit corporation dedicated to community development through the mobilization of resources to meet the needs for housing, emergency and other social services for the low and moderate income citizens of Tillamook County.

Program Overview:

Incorporated in 1991, CARE is Tillamook County's multi-function social services agency working to alleviate the effects of poverty. CARE's current services include emergency shelter, rapid rehousing and permanent supportive housing, case management, walk in financial assistance to homeless and low-income people; Healthy Families home visiting for families who are expecting or have infants; community development and advocacy; and owning and operating two senior and disabled assisted living communities – Kilchis House and Nehalem Bay House. Our programs focus on helping our most vulnerable populations in our communities.

Faith in Action provides hearts and hands that assist people of all ages to enrich lives with hope and joy.

Program Overview:

Faith in Action volunteers serve the chronically ill, disabled, frail, elderly, and mentally ill with in-home respite care, friendly visiting, local transportation, and more. In addition to in-home volunteers, Wellspring Respite Day Center offers an affordable “day away” for family caregivers for their loved ones who have cognitive or physical limitations. Wellspring now offers 4 respite days per month for a nominal fee, with financial assistance available. There is no charge for in-home services.

Volunteer Opportunities:

Faith in Action volunteers serve the chronically ill, disabled, frail, and elderly. In-home volunteers provide in-home respite care, friendly visiting, local transportation, and more. Wellspring Respite Day Center volunteers work as a team with a licensed nurse to provide interesting activities, gentle exercise, and tender loving care for adults. This gives their family caregiver 6 hours away from the 24/7 duties of caregiving. Volunteers receive training and support to help ensure a good experience for both the volunteer and the care receiver.

Faith in Action measures success in lives touched with hope and joy: a neighbor living in his or her own home because a volunteer helps with house work or grocery shopping or bringing in 40-lb bags of pellets for the stove; a care giver refreshed by a respite care “day away”; an elderly person who can live alone because a volunteer stops by regularly; a volunteer who finds renewed joy in serving others.

Mission Statement:

Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, community and hope.

Program Overview:

Housing instability - including frequent moves, overcrowding, and the threat of eviction or foreclosure - creates stress, depression and hopelessness for far too many families. Adults living in housing that they struggle to afford often describe themselves as less healthy, and the well-being and development of millions of children is compromised by living in insecure housing. Families paying too high a percentage of their income for housing often find themselves making impossible choices: Rent or health care? Food or transportation? A decent and affordable place to live helps families by freeing them from such physical and mental hardships and placing them on a path of new opportunity and increased confidence and self-reliance. A family's partnership with Habitat means they have a stable place to live and to spend time together. A decent roof over their heads establishes home as a place that protects - instead of endangering - their health. Habitat works with families to help them acquire the access, skills and financial education necessary for them to be successful homeowners. Through shelter, we empower. At Tillamook County Habitat for Humanity, we build. We build because we believe that everyone, everywhere, should have a healthy, affordable place to call home. More than building homes, we build communities, we build hope and we build the opportunity for families to help themselves. Habitat homebuyers help build their own homes alongside volunteers and pay an affordable mortgage.

Programs:

Homeownership: Tillamook County Habitat for Humanity has built 27 affordable homes for low-income families. We have provided stability for 53 adults and 40 children since 1998. Our partner families are mentored and required to complete 500 volunteer hours working on their home and other community projects.

Ramps & Rails: In 2016, an increased need to expand our services to help low income seniors, people with disabilities, and veterans by providing affordable in-home safety modifications to help mitigate fall risks. We provide the materials and discounted labor through volunteers to install wheelchair ramps and grab bars.

ReStore: The ReStore specializes in providing the community with discounted building materials, recycled and new, through the generous donations of goods from community members. The proceeds go towards supporting our building programs. The ReStore is open Mon.-Sat. 9 am to 5 pm. Donation pick-ups can be scheduled online at tillamookhabitat.org.

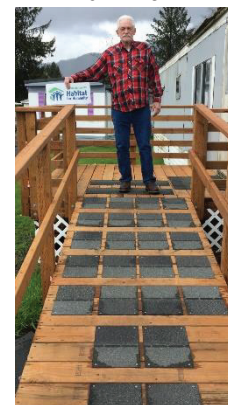

Mission Statement:

To provide accessible, effective, and comprehensive healthcare and education, assuring optimal health and well-being for all in our community, regardless of health conditions or financial circumstances.

Program Overview:

Rinehart Clinic is compassionate community care at its best. A non-profit family health center on the North Oregon Coast, the clinic provides comprehensive and personalized healthcare to everyone who comes through its doors.

Rinehart Clinic is recognized by the Oregon Health Authority for its commitment to patient-centered care, where the patient plays an important role in their own health. The healthcare staff takes a team approach, collaborating on all levels to ensure the best approach for each individual patient through creative patient-centered programs. The clinic has a full complement of care providers, including a Medical Doctor, an Adult Nurse Practitioner who provides primary care for patients 13 and older, a Family Nurse Practitioner who provides care for children and the entire family, and two Licensed Clinical Social Workers who offer guidance for safely managing health concerns related to chronic medical conditions, anxiety, depression, substance abuse, and more.

The clinic accepts most insurance plans, including the Oregon Health Plan and Medicaid. As a Federally Qualified Health Center, Rinehart Clinic offers a sliding fee scale to all patients based on income to help patients who may have difficulty paying their healthcare bills. Individual and corporate donations also help offset the cost of providing service to those in the community who need care.

Events & Programs:

Rinehart Clinic offers a variety of programs, events, and classes throughout the year to help patients and other community members take control of their own health. These include ongoing classes and support groups aimed at weight loss, addiction recovery, and Living Well with Diabetes and other chronic conditions. North Fork Nehalem River- Coho Salmon Harvest

Mission Statement: The purpose of the Smiley Brothers Salmon project is to fulfill the ancient promise of the salmon – to feed the people. Excess salmon are taken from the North Fork Nehalem Fish Hatchery to be canned in Garibaldi, then donated to the local food bank. This is a collaboration with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, 20+ volunteers, Garibaldi Landing, the North County Food Bank and Tillamook regional Food Banks.

Program Overview: This is a truly community-based project – our fish, feeding our people, supporting jobs at the cannery, community service for the High School, and high-quality Omega-3 proteins with a long, stable shelf life available to our most vulnerable populations. In addition to the 2,000 cans of salmon on average to the Food Bank for the past 8 years, fresh salmon fillets are taken to Nehalem Bay House and Kilchis House assisted living communities, so our treasured senior citizens receive fresh salmon dinners.

Since 2009, over 3,500 food-grade quality salmon have been canned, and over 10,000 cans of salmon have been distributed through our local food banks.

This year, Smiley Brothers (and Sisters) took over 500 salmon to Garibaldi Landing that's ready for canning, and we need your help. The cannery provides the processing at cost which also keeps several workers employed during the "off" season.
