**Who we are:** Columbia Pacific CCO is a coordinated care organization (CCO). Oregon's nonprofit CCOs provide health insurance, but that's not all. We also support programs that create healthy communities by increasing access to fresh food and safe, affordable housing, promoting early literacy and trauma-informed care, and much more.

**Who we serve:** All Oregon Health Plan (OHP) members living in Tillamook, Clatsop and Columbia counties. OHP is Oregon's Medicaid program. It provides health insurance for individuals and families who meet certain income requirements.

**What we offer:** Through our growing network of providers – doctors, nurse practitioners, counselors and more – we offer physical, dental and mental health care, and substance use treatment. We also offer important services like these:

- ▶ Language interpreter services
- ▶ Transportation options
- ▶ Care coordination
- ▶ Pharmacy



## VOLUNTEER:

LNCT needs volunteers in many aspects of our work: invasive species removal, trash cleanup, restoration planting, land monitoring, community garden program, event support, mailings, and office work.

LNCT was formed in 2002 to protect and restore natural habitats in the Lower Nehalem Watershed/Neahkahnie Mountain region of the North Oregon Coast. Skilled staff, an energetic board of directors, and dedicated volunteers provide a unique solution for accomplishing our mission. Our values guide our focus in three key areas: conservation, community, and education.



Our generous donors have helped us preserve over 300 acres in our service area. Our stewardship volunteers assist in the monitoring and restoration work of our properties. Our community garden program provides fresh organic produce for member families and to the North County Food Bank and senior meals programs.

We strive to engage our community through workshops, field trips, and various volunteer opportunities, nurturing conservation values and knowledge applicable to participants daily lives and the place they call home.



## Meals for Seniors, Inc.

**Mission Statement:** *Our mission is to enable the senior citizens of North Tillamook County to continue living independently in their own homes by providing access to nutritious meals and social occasions.*

**Overview:** Since 2003 we have been preparing and serving freshly made, nutritious meals three times a week, 52 weeks a year, to Seniors of North Tillamook County. Meals for Seniors, Inc. in Rockaway Beach is a registered 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. We are a volunteer managed and operated organization and funding for our program comes from donations and grants. In 2020 we prepared 10,893 meals. Our volunteers gave us 4,290 of their personal time and those who deliver meals drove 2,340 miles to get meals to our homebound citizens. We have been hit hard by the pandemic and unable to host our own fundraisers for over 18 months, yet through the generosity of many we have been able to keep our doors open. Meals are served Monday, Wednesday and Friday and we ask that you arrive by 11:30 am. Our dining hall is located at St. Mary by the Sea church at 275 S. Pacific Ave. in Rockaway Beach.

## About Rinehart Clinic:

Rinehart Clinic is compassionate community care at its best. A non-profit family health center on the North Oregon Coast, the clinic provides personalized healthcare to all in our community, regardless of financial circumstances.

Rinehart Clinic is recognized by the Oregon Health Authority for its commitment to patient-centered care. Services available at the clinic include primary care for the whole family, naturopathic medicine, acupuncture, mental health counseling, well-child exams, women's health, immunizations, on-site lab services, addiction counseling, 24-hour on-call availability, and health insurance assistance. Several team members are bilingual (English/Spanish). There is also an on-site pharmacy for the convenience of patients and the community. It is the only retail pharmacy between Seaside and Tillamook.

The clinic accepts insurance, including the Oregon Health Plan, Medicare, and most private insurance plans. A sliding fee scale is offered to all patients based on income, and as a Federally Qualified Health Center the clinic has programs available to help patients who may have difficulty paying their health care bills.

Looking to the future and the clinic's place in the community, the Rinehart Clinic Board of Directors recently announced its decision to change the name of the clinic to Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy. Over the course of the next year (2022), Rinehart Clinic will transition to the new name.

As a non-profit community health center, Rinehart Clinic depends on a variety of funding, including federal and other grants. The clinic is also grateful for the generosity of private donors who help offset the cost of providing services to those in the community who need care.

Sammy's Place began in 2006 with a modest vision to provide respite for those experiencing intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD) on the coast of Oregon. After strategic planning in 2014 Sammy's Place has steadily grown the vision, the board of directors, and supporters.

Sammy's Place today has two primary areas of focus, the **Oregon COAST Network** [Communities of All Abilities Succeeding Together] that provides networking and education, and the **Thompson Acres LLC** project, a focus on home ownership for everyone including those who experience I/DD to live alongside their peers.

In 2019 Sammy's Place acquired 3 acres of land several blocks from the downtown area of the small village of Nehalem on the Coast of Oregon. Close by is public transportation, a recreation/community center, shops, a small market, and public river access for recreation such as kayaking and fishing. The property came with the need of a massive environmental cleanup.



Today, the cleanup is near complete with the major work conducted in partnership with the Oregon Dept. of Environmental Quality (DEQ), the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and many volunteer hours. Removed were an RV, three automobiles, a dilapidated house, solid waste, tires, old petroleum drums, and over 100 tons of scrap metal! Recent major funding was just received from the Collins Foundation for a new paid Executive Director!

## Helping fish and Oregonians

**WHAT IS THE SALMON SUPERHWY?** The Salmon SuperHwy is an unprecedented effort to restore access to nearly 180 miles of blocked habitat throughout six major salmon and steelhead rivers of Oregon’s North Coast. Using a strategic, scaled approach to maximize benefits and minimize costs, a unique, community partnership will complete 93 culvert projects in 10 years. As of October 2021, we’re over half way there with more than 115 miles reconnected. Each year the Salmon SuperHwy reconnects more historic habitat, reduces chronic flooding, improves recreation opportunities and stimulates the local economy.

**HOW DOES IT WORK?** Each Salmon SuperHwy project involves repairing a section of a waterway that has become a difficult area for fish to pass in order to spawn, feed or flourish. In most cases, replacing a degrading or failing culvert is the solution. The Salmon SuperHwy partners work together amplifying funding, and project coordination for each culvert project while creating jobs to handle engineering and construction. Each project benefits fish, the watershed and local residents, but goes far beyond by keeping roads open and flooding at bay which benefits road safety, local industry, tourism and the local economy.

This is a collaboration with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, 10+ volunteers, FishPeople/Garibaldi Landing, Bell Buoy of Seaside, the North County Food Bank and Oregon Food Bank Tillamook Services.

This is a truly community-based project – our fish, feeding our people, supporting jobs at the cannery, community service for the High School, and high-quality Omega-3 proteins with a long, stable shelf life available to our most vulnerable populations.

The 2020 bounty delivered over 6,000 cans of salmon to every food pantry program in Tillamook County, including school backpack programs, the Free Little Pantries and more. In addition to the cans of salmon, fresh salmon fillets are provided to local assisted living communities and to senior meal programs. Since 2009, over 6,000 food-grade quality salmon canned, and over 16,000 cans of salmon distributed by our local food banks. Neah-Kah-Nie High School art students designed this year’s label.




