We the owners of the property identified in this application desire the Tillamook County Public Works Department to not include the right-of-way adjacent to this property in the chemical vegetation control work (weed spraying) performed by County. We agree to maintain the vegetation within the right-of-way per Exhibit A "Landowner Right-of-Way Maintenance Agreement Standards". We agree to maintain the county provided "No Spray" signs.

We agree that, should the above-mentioned vegetation be not adequately controlled, or that the signs are not maintained or conspicuous, this agreement shall be null & void. We further agree to indemnify, defend, and save harmless County from and against any legal proceedings, demands, claims, losses, injuries, damages, expenses, or costs connected with any injury to any person or damage to any property or any loss to County occasioned by the permit holders failure to abate weeds, brush, and other vegetation to allow adequate sightlines for the traveling public.

Exhibit "A" Landowner Right-of-Way Maintenance Agreement Standards



Zone A – Shoulder

- Mow or spray. Water must drain away from the edge of the road.
- Limb trees to provide a vertical distance, 15 feet minimum up to 20 feet maximum (to the back of “Zone C”). This improves sight distance, minimizes fallen limbs on the road, and increases the amount of sun on the road.

Zone B – Ditch

- Mow or spray to the bottom of the ditch. Water must enter the ditch unimpeded.
- Maintain clean ditches. The flow of water must not be obstructed.
- Limb to vertical clearance, 15 feet minimum or 20 feet maximum or as needed (to the back of “Zone C”)

Zone C – Ditch to the Edge of Right-of-Way*

- Spray – as deemed necessary to control noxious weeds or to improve sight distance.
- Brush as needed to maintain sight distance.
- Limb to vertical clearance, 15 feet minimum or 20 feet maximum or as needed (to the back of “Zone C”), but generally not past power poles.

* Property owners that have a valid Landowner Right-of-Way Vegetation Maintenance Agreement may have vegetation in “Zone B/C” as long as it does not interfere with the functionality of the ditch line, impede sight distance, or create a safety hazard, as determined by the Road Foreman.
