

Tillamook County Giving Guide features artwork from Sitka's Youth Art Program. Learn more about this incredible program and the communications, history and art lesson that created these "Tree of Life" watercolor paintings.

Sitka Center for Art and Ecology is a 53-years-young 501 (c)(3) nonprofit located at Cascade Head in southern Tillamook County. Sitka champions art and nature access for all. We aim to serve everyone from preschoolers to professionals with opportunities to explore their creativity and deepen their relationships with the natural word.

Each month, Sitka's Youth Program delivers 60-90-minute art literacy sessions in classrooms of schools with limited or no art programs of their own. Currently Sitka serves nearly 2,000 youth grades PreK to 8 in all three Tillamook School Districts and at Toledo Elementary in Lincoln County School District.

During October's lesson, students explored the ways in which symbols have been used throughout history as a form of nonverbal communication. Students used artistic inspirations of Indigenous graffiti artist KC Hall and Ashland, Oregon artist Betty LaDuke to create their own personal tree of life with embedded Morse Code messages (see the key below). Each young artist's tree features their interests and inspirations, and the influences that help them grow and root them in their communities.

Youth Program Manager Leeauna Perry shared that this project opened new realms of communication for the students. Students felt safe and supported to share some of their greatest accomplishments and the most challenging obstacles in their lives. Conversations about heritage, aspirations, and the ability to find strength to overcome adversity fostered peer empathy, connection, and a shared sense of community.

Experienced art instructors, practitioners who engage with Sitka's Residency Program and known regional artists and ecologists leading their fields are featured within the art literacy curriculum, providing inspiration and access to STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math), arts and cultural career paths.

Since we can only include a few of the thousands (yes, thousands) of student artwork in the Giving Guide, and each one tells an incredible story – Sitka, the Pioneer and other community partners will display the art throughout the community. MISSION: To provide a safe haven for lost dogs in Tillamook county by assisting law enforcement through intake, shelter, reunification and adoption. To promote responsible pet ownership and animal welfare through community outreach, education and licensing.

With the help of our volunteers, we provide care for the dogs at our shelter. Our staff handles intakes, adoptions and releases. We hold the animals for five days. If we aren't able to find the owners, the dogs become available for adoption. A dog in our care receives two meals a day, any needed medical attention, along with socialization, exercise and love.



We have opportunities to sponsor a kennel, or play yard. Monetary donations can be mailed to our PO BOX or made through our website. We accept donations of food, toys, leashes, harnesses, towels, and blankets. We have a bin at the Tillamook Farmer's Co-Op for any physical donations or you can call us to schedule a drop off appointment. A link to our Amazon wish list is posted on our website. We have a BottleDrop account for those who would like to donate their cans and bottles. We are happy to arrange pick up of any cans and bottles you may choose to donate.



We are looking for Board Members! We are also looking for animal loving volunteers to participate in all the aspects of caring for dogs such as feeding, watering, petting, walking, training, scooping poop, doing laundry, cutting grass, maintaining our structures, participating in fund raising efforts, sharing lost and/or available dogs on social media, fostering, transporting to the vet, taking dogs to the groomer, bathing the stinky, treating the sickly, and loving them all. Must be 18 or older or minors must be 16 and accompanied by a guardian.


Food Pantry/Clothing Bank

Meals for Seniors

Mission Statement: Our mission is to enable the senior citizens of North Tillamook County to continue living independently in their own homes by providing access to nutritious meals and social occasions. Since 2003, Meals for Seniors, Inc. has been preparing, serving, and delivering fresh meals to our senior citizens. Meals are served Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 11:30 am, at the dining facility located at St. Mary by the Sea Church in Rockaway Beach. We also deliver meals to homebound seniors residing between Garibaldi and Nehalem. We have situations where our deliveries may be the only meal a senior has on a given day. In 2022 we prepared 12,058 meals of which 7,263 were delivered to our vulnerable homebound seniors in North Tillamook County.

Volunteer: We are a volunteer driven organization supported soley by donations from individuals, organizations, grants, and our own fundraisers. In 2022 our volunteers donated 4,618 hours of their time and drove 6,708 miles to deliver hot meals to our vulnerable homebound seniors. Volunteer drivers and kitchen volunteers are always welcome.

About Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy:

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy (formerly known as the Rinehart Clinic) is a nonprofit Community Health Center on the North Oregon Coast that provides quality health care services to the entire community, regardless of a person's financial circumstances.

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy is recognized by the Oregon Health Authority for its commitment to patient-centered care. Services include primary care for the whole family, naturopathic medicine, acupuncture, mental health counseling, well-child exams, women's health, immunizations, on-site lab services, addiction counseling, 24-hour on-call availability, patient transportation, and health insurance assistance. Several team members are bilingual (English/Spanish), and professional interpreter services are available for anyone who needs language assistance. There is also an on-site pharmacy for the convenience of patients and the community.

The care team also offers wellness classes and activities that are free and open to the community. In addition, Nehalem Bay Health Center operates the Neah-Kah-Nie (NKN) Student Health & Wellness Center, a school-based health center located at Neah-Kah-Nie High School that serves the students and staff of the NKN School District.

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy accepts insurance, including the Oregon Health Plan, Medicare, and most private insurance plans. A sliding fee scale is available to all patients based on income and, as a Federally Qualified Health Center, there are programs available to help patients who may have difficulty paying their health care bills.

In May of 2023, Nehalem Bay Health District voters approved a bond measure that will help fund a new, expanded facility for Nehalem Bay Health Center on property in Wheeler, Oregon owned by the health district. The measure will allow for expanded services and specialty care. We are grateful to the voters and the property tax payers who will help Nehalem Bay Health Center usher in a new era of community health care.

As a non-profit Community Health Center, Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy depends on a variety of funding, including federal and other grants. The center is also grateful for the generosity of private donors who help offset the cost of providing services to those in our community who need care.

His intent was to serve Seniors in much the same way that President Roosevelt later implemented in the creation of the Social Security Act of 1935.

The Center provides a place Seniors can visit, interact with others, use their minds, and have a healthy and nutritious meal at the Meal Site, (5 days a week). The Meal Site is run by North West Seniors and Disability and is accessed from 4th Street, the westerly 1/3 of the Senior Center Building. When our Seniors are healthy on all levels, the entire community benefits. We are Seniors helping Seniors.

Events: Members Monday morning coffee hour – 8 to 11, come enjoy a hot drink, served with treats. Card games – Pinochle, Cribbage. Sewing Classes, Quilting, Arts and Crafting. Wellness Check twice a month during Monday Coffee Hour. Square Dancing. Twice yearly Rummage Sales. Acitvity Room rental for family events.
